FSA TESTS: Message to Parents

Our students are participating in the Foundation Skills Assessment (FSA) this year. The Foundation Skills Assessment is an annual province-wide assessment of British Columbia students' academic skills, and provides a snapshot of how well BC students are learning basic skills in Reading Comprehension, Writing, and Numeracy. The main purpose of the assessment is to help the province, school districts, schools and school planning councils evaluate how well students are achieving basic skills, and to make plans to improve student achievement. The assessment is administered each year to Grade 4 and 7 students in the public and provincially funded private schools.

The FSA is designed and developed in BC under the guidance of the Ministry of Education using professional test-making processes and protocols. The ministry employs teams of practicing BC teachers and subject specialists, led by test-design specialists, to develop the assessments. The assessment design and development process is rigorous and continuous and results in a test that is relevant and congruent with provincial curriculum and standards.

The FSA takes approximately 270 (4.5 hours) minutes to administer. This year the FSA is being administered during January. The assessments will be marked and results for individual students will be ready to send home by the end of March. School reports will be ready before the end of the school year. This time line will allow time for teachers and parents to confer about student results and to address concerns before the end of the school year.

1. The Board approved the Consent Agenda which contained the following reports/information:

2. The Board received an engaging presentation from District Library Coordinator Andrea Wallin on the Digital Literacy Innovation Project.
3. The Board was pleased to present the OWL Award for Excellence in Public Education to this year's recipient, Mr. Chris Rose. The award was established by School District No. 73 to recognize an individual, group, or organization that has distinguished themselves by providing outstanding service to public education in the Kamloops/Thompson School District.
4. The Board enjoyed a presentation from District Literacy Coordinator Fiona Clare on upcoming events sponsored by Literacy in Kamloops (LinK), Interior Savings, and other partner groups. Family Literacy Week runs from January 21-28, 2017 which includes a variety of free Unplug and Play Week Activities.
5. The Board received a presentation from District Early Years Coordinator, Marianne Vande Pol, and Manager Sue Lissel from Make Children First, on the 2016 Early Development Instrument (EDI) results.
6. The Board received a report from Director Smillie on the 2016 Foundation Skills Assessment (FSA) results.
